Ops Report:

- There was a 31% drop in 'A' crimes throughout the Honeydew precinct for the month.
- The Captain read out the crime numbers for sector 2 and sector 5 but was unable to give us percentages.
- The Captain mentioned that he would be responsible to crime in the sector and must make sure that it remains low.
- The Captain requested community feedback to enable him to do his job to the best of his ability.
